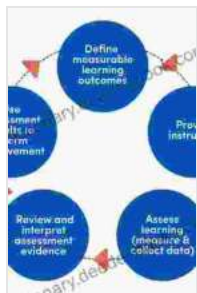

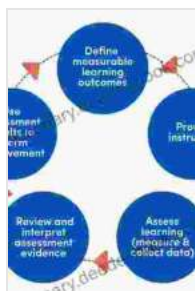
### Example 3: Global Citizenship through Virtual Exchange
