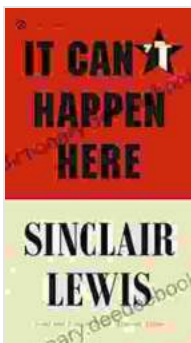


It Can Happen Here: A Warning from the Past

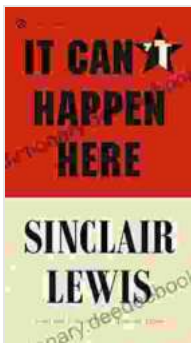
