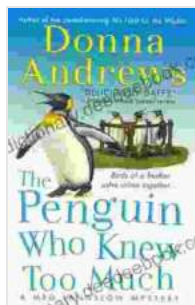

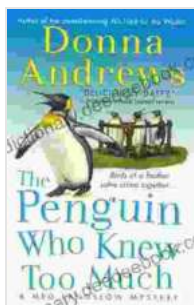
Setting
